

Oregon State University Fermentation Science Students Honored with Jack Joyce Scholarships

Roque Ales & Spirits and Columbia Distributing Celebrate Roque Founder

Portland, Ore. (Feb. 2, 2021) — Two Oregon State University Fermentation Science students were awarded a combined total of \$40,000 through the <u>Jack Joyce Scholarship</u> last Thursday night in a virtual ceremony. The Jack Joyce Scholarship, established in 2014 by <u>Columbia</u>

<u>Distributing</u> and <u>Rogue Ales & Spirits</u> as a tribute to the late Rogue founder Jack Joyce, was created to further students' passion and desire for fermentation science, including craft brewing.

To date, the scholarship has awarded over \$400,000 to 34 students, including Alyssa Thibodeau and Cade Jobe, the 2020 winners.

"What a bright light in an otherwise dark year," said Lindsi Taylor, Director of Corporate Communications at Columbia Distributing. "We weren't going to let anything stand in our way of honoring more students and fueling their education. We need reasons to celebrate right now and this has been our favorite evening of the year for the past seven years. Obviously, it was very different, but just as exciting!"

"We are proud to honor his legacy, especially during this difficult time, and award scholarships to passionate students who will be the future of our industry."
